HK / Macau Nationals

- Effective February 7, 2020, applications for temporary entry stays (landing visas and online visas) and "Online Application System for Foreigners" for Hong Kong and Macau residents have been suspended.
- In case of exceptional circumstances, if you need to travel to Taiwan, you must present Entry and Exit Certification Records issued by the HK and Macau governments to prove that you have no travel history to mainland China within previous 14 days. All applications are to be processed by Taipei Economic & Cultural Offices (TECO) abroad.
- HK and Macau residents who have obtained or hold valid Entry and Exit documents for Taiwan before Feb 7, 2020; have valid residence permits for Taiwan; or traveling to Taiwan from countries (regions) outside Hong Kong, and Macau must all be subject to 14 days Self-health Management Protocol.

Other Foreign Nationals

- Effective February 7, 2020, foreign nationals who have visited or resided in the PRC over the past 14 days before they arrive in Taiwan will be prohibited from entering Taiwan (including those who are eligible for visa-exempt treatment, landing visas, and e-visas, as well as those carrying valid visas).
- Foreign nationals seeking to enter Taiwan may apply for an entry visa as long as they have not visited or resided in areas in the PRC during the previous 14 days. When applying for a visa, foreign nationals must provide the following documents for the Taiwanese overseas mission (TECO) to process the application per relevant regulations:

- Full travel history comprising the previous 14 days. (Applications submitted by those who have visited or resided in the PRC during this period will not be accepted.)
- Certificate of a health checkup conducted in the previous seven (7) days showing that the applicant does not have a fever of 38 degrees Celsius or higher and is not suffering from the respiratory tract or lung infections.
- Signed affidavit stipulating that the applicant shall immediately notify health authorities in Taiwan when experiencing any symptoms detailed in the paragraph above.
- Other documents required for entry visas to Taiwan based on the purpose of the visit.

3. Foreign nationals possessing a valid Taiwan Resident Certificate (ARC) who have visited or resided in the PRC in the previous 14 days shall be subject to 14 days Self-health Management Protocol.

4. Starting from 0:00 am of February 10, 2020, travelers who transit through China, Hong Kong, and Macau and are granted entry into Taiwan and will be required to be subject to 14 days Self-health Management Protocol.
